The North Lake Concept envisions construction of a horseshoe-shaped lake at the north end of the Salton Sea. The project would provide habitat for fish and birds while protecting the surrounding area from flooding. At this early stage, the current plan is to pump water from the nearby Whitewater River and blend it with water pumped from the Salton Sea to cover exposed lakebed. The new lake could span over five square miles, or about five times the size of Lake Arrowhead. The size and scope of the project are still being determined. Local partners include Riverside County and the Salton Sea Authority.

## Goals

- New Habitat: Approximately 3,680 acres of wildlife habitat.
- Community Benefit: To be determined in scoping phase
- Flood Control: Protection from occasional flooding from Whitewater River
